Wanda SLSC Patrol Rules

- 1) Patrol Members are allowed a maximum of two (2) deficit patrols throughout the entire season. In the event that a patrol member is not available for a rostered patrol, the member **MUST** organise a substitute. Failure to meet minimum patrol requirements may result in:
 - a. Penalty Patrols at the discretion of the Club Captain and the Director of Lifesaving,
 - b. Exclusion of club sanctioned events,
 - c. Exclusion from carnival entry,
 - d. Exclusion from the use of club equipment including the gym,
 - e. Suspension or expulsion from the club with repeated abuses.
- 2) A patrol member is expected to attend the patrol for the entirety of the rostered time. Should this not be possible the member is to advise the respective Patrol Captain prior to the commencement of the patrol and in a timely manner so that suitable arrangements can be made to ensure the minimum patrol requirements are met.
- 3) A patrol member must not leave the beach without the consent of the Patrol Captain. Failure to comply with this rule **WILL** result in the Patrol Captain removing the member from the patrol log and a deficit patrol.
- 4) Patrol Members must wear their full patrol uniform which includes a red and yellow patrol cap, patrol short and patrol shirt. Failure to meet this requirement will result in the Patrol Captain removing the respective member from the patrol log and a deficit patrol.
- 5) Patrol Captains are held responsible by the Director of Lifesaving and the Club Captain for the efficiency of their patrols and shall:
 - a. See that members become accustomed to the use of radios,
 - b. Put their patrols through a "proficiency test" consisting of questions on: signals and surf awareness, basic first aid, a practical demonstration of resuscitation and a run-swim-run to a level acceptable to the Director of Lifesaving,
 - c. Completion of patrol log with the relevant information,
 - d. Control use of all lifesaving equipment.
- 6) In case of extreme necessity, Patrol Captains may make any decision regarding lifesaving that the Club Captain or Director of Lifesaving is empowered to make.
- 7) In the event of a patrol finishing its rostered patrol and there not being five (5) bronze medallion holders of the oncoming patrol on duty, then the retiring patrol must remain to ensure a minimum of five (5) bronze medallion members remain on the beach until such time that the situation is rectified.
- 8) Morning patrol will be responsible putting the IRB in an operational state, establishing the patrol area and to sign-on with Surfcom Sydney.
- 9) Afternoon patrol will be responsible for packing up the patrol area, cleaning (hosing down) of patrol equipment and IRB and to sign-off with Surfcom Sydney.
- 10) **All members are bound by these rules. Breaches to these rules will be dealt with in a fair and consistent manner for ALL members.**
